

## ORDINANCE #03

NOTICE: Notice is hereby given that the following proposed ordinance will be presented to the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Milford, Bucks County, Pa., for action at a regular meeting of the Board to be held Friday, August 5, 1960, at 7:00 o'clock P.M., D. S. T., at the regular meeting place in the Township Hall of the said Township:

ORDINANCE #3: AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MILFORD, COUNTY OF BUCKS, AND STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA, PROHIBITING NUISANCES, AND DEFINING THE SAME WHICH INCLUDES THE MAINTENANCE OR OPERATION OF ANY PLACE FOR THE STORAGE OF ABANDONED, JUNKED AND OTHER AUTOMOBILES POSSESSED FOR THE PURPOSE OF DISMANTLING, SELLING PARTS THEREFROM AND LIKE USES ON EITHER PRIVATE OR PUBLIC PROPERTY, EXCEPT IN THE COURSE OF REPAIRING THE SAME IN THE REGULAR CONDUCT OF BUSINESS.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Supervisors of the Township of Milford, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ORDAINED and ENACTED by the authority of the same:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, corporation or partnership to set up, maintain, operate, possess or conduct any place or places anywhere within the said Township of Milford where second-hand, abandoned, junked or partially destroyed or damaged automobiles are stored and from which parts are dismantled or sold or offered for sale or which are being accumulated for any other purpose whatsoever, except in the course of repairing the same in the regular and usual conduct of business.

SECTION 2. The said acts prohibited by Section 1 of this Ordinance, to wit: the setting up, maintaining, operating, possession of or conducting any place or places anywhere within said Township where second-hand, abandoned, junked or partially destroyed or damaged automobiles are stored and from which parts are dismantled or sold or offered for sale, are each declared to be a public nuisance and the parties violating the provisions of this Ordinance by so doing to be guilty of the commission of a nuisance and subject to the penalties and fines hereinafter provided for and enacted.

SECTION 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance hereinbefore declared to be unlawful, or to constitute a nuisance, shall be subject to the imposition of a fine or penalty of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each such offense, and a further penalty of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each ten (10) days that he or she may have continued in such violation after the proceedings for violation hereof have been instituted. Proceeding for the violation of the said unlawful acts as aforesaid, and for the collection of said fines and penalties imposed hereunder, shall be instituted before a Justice of the Peace of our said township, and may be commenced by Warrant or by Summons at the discretion of the Justice of the Peace before whom the proceeding is begun. No warrant shall be issued except upon complaint on oath or affirmation specifying the violation of this Ordinance, and all proceedings shall be directed to and served by a Constable of this Township. The Warrant shall be returnable forthwith and upon such return, like proceedings shall be had as in cases of summary conviction. Fines and penalties which are imposed by said Justice of the Peace in such summary proceedings before whom the same is instituted, may be collected as like fines and penalties are collected in summary proceedings, and in default of

payment when so proceeded against, the offender convicted before such Justice of the Peace shall be sentenced to serve a term in jail in the County of Bucks for the period of one (1) day for each One Dollar (\$1.00) of fines and costs that said convicted party has refused, or neglected to forthwith pay on said conviction.

SECTION 4. If any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not effect the validity of the remaining parts. The supervisors hereby declare that they would have ordained the remaining sections, provisions or parts if they had known of the invalidity of any such invalid section, provision or part.

SECTION 5. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to any existing automobile junkyards in the Township of Milford.
